


Behavior Technician/ABA Instructor

- Work well with teams (staff, families, and clinical consultants)
- Provide one-to-one behavior intervention services to a variety of children with autism and related disorders.
- Maintain a positive attitude and show enthusiasm at work every day
- Implement programs developed by teacher and BCBA
- Provide support in crisis situations, consistently implementing predetermined behavioral strategies
- Timely and accurate notification and documentation of incidents and plans
- Maintain accurate data and graphing on all designated programs
- Receive feedback in a professional manner and work independently with initial direction
- May accompany assigned student across environments (e.g., home and community) implementing behavioral objectives
- May work with other specialists and/or parents to implement additional specified goals and objectives
- Must be able to lift 50lbs and Drive
